

We do NOT have students leave campus during the day unless picked up at the school by family. With Maple Drive, an industrial road with no sidewalks, and Hwy #97, being our major access routes, QJS continues to be a closed campus. Imagine up to 520 students roaming the road access and highway, and South Quesnel businesses (not all with sidewalk access). Families are welcome to come pick up their student at any time, just call and check them out at the office, or drop off food items for them, you can drop them off at the office for students to pick up during the break. We do our best <u>not</u> to have interruptions of class time with deliveries; as you can imagine, this can be very disruptive to learning when students "just pop out to pick up" items delivered, then return to class to eat and/or share items.


Thanks for helping us to keep your children safe, and for respecting our attempts to protect a productive learning environment for all students.


