- c. Thursday, September 4th, First Day for Grade 9 -all day (with grade 8s at school)
- 3. Where to get information?

 - b. Parent Handbook (Students have one also) see current handbook on the school website

- 4. What are PODs? Next year QJS has 6 PODs or community learning groups; 3 for grade 9 and 3 for grade 8. This structure is a stepping stone from elementary to high school, providing students with a team of teachers who will work with the POD students for their two years here. Research finds that strong relationships and good attendance are the keys to learning success. Your child will likely be in the same POD for their two years with us.
- 5. Why to get involved and stay involved? At this age, we often think our children don't want us involved, however this is a critical 2 years for young people. There can be many changes and challenges as your young teen tries to navigate the socially complex world of thirteen and fourteen year olds.
 - a. Watch for invitations to events, workshops, Q & A sessions intended to help you support your child in this two year journey from childhood to young adulthood.
- 6. <u>Communicate</u> questions and concerns as soon as possible during the year; it is rare that we have a problem we cannot solve so long as we know about it!
